- b) **ESA Virtual Conference (planned for Barcelona) in 2021**

At the ESA general conference that was completely virtual (planned for Barcelona) in 2021 we organized 2 semi-plenaries, 5 joint sessions and regular sessions with a total of 80 presentations, selected from over 120 submissions to our network.
