Activities:

1) Midterm Conference

"Ageing in Europe: Agency, Citizenship and the Dynamics of Power", Brno, Czech Republic, 5th to 7th September 2018

The conference was co-organized by the Office for Population Studies and the Department of Sociology of the Faculty of Social Studies, Masaryk University in Brno. During the three-day event, the 58 participants from 13 countries (Austria, Belgium, the Czech Republic, Finland, Germany, Great Britain, Lithuania, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia, Sweden, the Netherlands, and Turkey) gave 47 presentations representing various fields from ageing

scholarship (for details, see Appendix 1 of this report). The conference programme included four keynote speeches and a moderated closing discussion among the invited speakers: Paul Higgs (University College London), Jolanta Perek-Białas (Jagiellonian University), Thomas Scharf (Newcastle University), and Sandra Torres (Uppsala University). 2) ESA Conference, Manchester, 20th to 23rd August 2019

We organized 20 Network sessions, with 74 scheduled presentations within the ESA conference. Our first semi-plenary on *Agency, Citizenship and the Dynamics of Power*, with presenters Bernhard Weicht and Ricca Edmondson, was very well attended. We will seek to include another semi-plenary at the next ESA conference.

We organized four joint sessions, with RN13 (Sociology of Family and Intimate Lives), RN16 (Sociology of Health and Illness), RN21 (Quantitative Methods) and RN37 (Urban Sociology).
